- Provide technical, and advisory support to internal and external customers and stakeholders;
- Provide timely advice and assistance on aviation safety and security matters to managers at all levels:
- Participate in safety and security committees of external parties (i.e. ACSA, SAPS and any other external party that contributes to operational implementation of the existing safety and security plans for the cargo terminal
- Interpret and communicate safety legislation, standards and codes;
- Play the role of management representative for ISO accreditation or similar accreditation of the Cargo Operation;
- Provide information, highlight key risks and provide technical support to the Manager: Cargo Terminal;
- Define and maintain aviation-related and cargo operations quality assurance; safety and security; occupational health and safety; and risk management policies and procedures;
- Create quality assurance visibility and alignment through effective communication and increased synergy and connectivity across work streams and divisions;
- Provide technical expertise for the compilation of training material and policy manuals to ensure knowledge transfer; and
- Utilise networking and development opportunities to remain abreast of the latest trends and technology.

Risk Management

- Manage the compliance of the Cargo Operations in line with existing National Key Point requirements;
- Monitor critical control measures in the Cargo Terminal and conduct weekly planning meetings with Cargo Operations management;
- Coordinate the Cargo Operations risk committee and ensure agendas are compiled and issues and actions are minuted;
- Plan and conduct safety and security risk/threat assessment audits;
- Compile the ICAO Safety Management System standards and report the same to the cargo manager.
- Conduct annual risk workshops for all components;
- Investigate and submit for processing to Finance division, any insurance claims relating to Cargo

- Ensure compliance with aviation safety and security training regulations and that all appropriate staff are put forward for necessary refresher training;
- Ensure compliance to SA CAA regulations and technical standards in the applicable areas of TradeHouse, relating to Aviation Security;
- Conduct regular aviation safety and security audits evaluations, surveys, threat analysis, etc. for the Cargo terminal and TradeHouse;
- Track corrective actions and action items to ensure compliance is established and maintained;
- Manage the entrenchment of desired safety behaviours;
- Develop and manage the implementation of systems, procedures and techniques to enhance individual and group pre-emptive capacity and awareness;
- Ensure effective Emergency Response Plans are in place including liaison with tenants, communities, ACSA and municipal services for the Cargo Terminal and TradeHouse environments; and
- Develop and drive testing programmes for ERP's and analyse results.

Project Management

- Participate in project meetings to provide support and report on legal, aviation safety and security and quality issues;
- Proactively identify risks associated with projects;
